## **Popular topics**

The live chats were full of admiration for the charitable work that the engineers undertook throughout their careers and concern for the sustainability of their projects. Showing a conscientious student body!

In the questions, initially the students focused almost exclusively on broader questions about the engineers' careers (What has been the toughest challenge you've faced in your career so far?), job satisfaction (If you could change one thing about your job, what would it be?) and inspiration (Do you think you would have still wanted to become an engineer if your teachers for engineer related subjects weren't as good (Ken, you mentioned your maths teacher and Harriet, you mentioned your physics teacher)?). After getting to know the engineers a bit better the students quizzed them on more specific subjects such as the logistics of their current projects.

Ken endeavoured to answer every question and inspired a lot of students to think more about working to support the third world.
